Dr. Glick is a tenured Professor of Surgery of the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences, University at Buffalo (UB) and Professor of Management, School of Management. He is the UUP Buffalo HSC Chapter President, member of the UUP Statewide Executive Committee and Chair of the Statewide UUP ad hoc Health and Safety Committee. While at UB, he has served on numerous hospital, departmental, and university committees. He will be celebrating 32 years of employment with UB in July 2021.

Phil was born and raised in Southern California. He received his undergraduate education at UC Berkeley (BS, Human Genetics) and went to medical school at UC San Francisco. He did his General Surgery Residency, Chief Residency and Fetal Surgery Residency at UCSF. He was a senior resident in Pediatric Surgery and Chief Resident in Pediatric Surgery at the University of Washington and The Children's Hospital, Seattle, Washington. He received his MBA at the Kellogg School of Management, Northwestern University. He is board certified in Pediatric Surgery and Adult General Surgery. His academic honors include Phi Beta Kappa Honor Society (UC Berkeley) and the Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society (UCSF).

Phil is an academic pediatric surgeon caring for surgical problems of fetuses, newborn infants, children, adolescents and adult survivors of congenital and childhood diseases. From 1988 until 2005, he led a national and internationally recognized research program (NIH Funded, RO1) in the following areas: lung development, congenital diaphragmatic hernia, and fetal physiology. Since obtaining his MBA in 2005, he is particularly focused on the effects of leadership and team management of aligned and integrated health care systems.

Phil has authored more than 156 peer reviewed journal articles, 41 non-peer reviewed articles, 15 cyber-publications, 8 books, 53 book chapters, >111 abstracts, and >59 scientific posters. He has been invited locally, nationally, and internationally to give more than 160 lectures and has been a national or international visiting professor on eight occasions.

Phil is the MBA Liaison for the UB Health Sciences Schools and the UB School of Management. In this capacity, he recruits medical students and GME trainees for the Dual and Accelerated MD/MBA programs. He teaches financial literacy and healthcare policy to medical students and GME trainees. He also teaches anatomy to the JSMBS MS1's and medical ethics to the JSMBS MS3's during their surgical clerkship.

In July of 2015, Phil began 4 years as the President of the UB Faculty Senate and the Chairperson of the University at Buffalo Faculty Senate Executive Committee. He is a recognized champion for Shared Governance and regularly "crosses the aisle" as a faculty advocate to work with the students and student associations, the professional staff and the Professional Staff Senate, UB Administration, UB Foundation, UB Alumni Groups and other UB Councils and Groups. His governance moto is: "Shared governance is not about saying no. It's about finding ways to move forward." The UB Shared Governance Team won the 2018 SUNY UFS Shared Governance Award.

Phil has been a SUNY UFS Senator for the last 6 years and for portions of that time served as the Sector Leader for the Academic Medical Centers and a member of the SUNY UFS Executive, Communications, Awards and Nominating Committees.

In his community, Phil has coached his children at various levels of baseball, softball, and hockey. He enjoys working out daily. He and his wife are active member of Temple Beth Zion and participate in a weekly Torah study group. He is a member of the WNY Venture Association and is a member/manager of the Buffalo Angels LLC. He volunteers for a variety of local not-for-profits including as an executive board member for the Western New York Broadcasting Association (WNED), a trustee of Temple Beth Zion, a volunteer for The Foundry Buffalo, and a judge for the 43North International Business Competition. In 2015, he received the Eisendrath Bearer of Light Award from the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ), for participation in the NAACP's "America's Journey for Justice" from Selma, AL, to Washington, D.C. He is a member of WNY delegation to AIPAC.

Phil resides in Williamsville, NY with his wife, Dr. Drucy S. Borowitz, who is a UB Emeritus Professor of Pediatrics.
